### Aerospace Industry Honored

An employees organization at the Systems Group of TRW Inc. has been honored by the State Assembly for its work with youth in the Mexican-Assembly's Rules Committee recently passed a resolution praising the efforts of TRW's Career Opportunities for Youth (COY) organization. The resolution was presented to the employees group and to TRW by Assemblyman L. E. (Larry) Townsend of the 67th District.

Gerardo Orellana, president of COY, and Dr. Richard C. DeLauer, vice president and general manager of TRW Systems Group, received the Assembly resolution on behalf of their respective organizations.

COY, working with the Los Angeles City School system, has developed a motivational program aimed at the potential high school dropout. The program is designed to acquaint Mexican-American students with the type of jobs, and the education required for such employment, in a large aerospace firm such as TRW.

The program includes tours of TRW's Space Park facilities in Redondo Beach, talks to student groups at their schools, individual counseling sessions, and a college scholarship fund.

Some 115 TRW employees belong to COY. They have been joined by many individuals outside the company who have heard about the program and are interested in assisting in the motivation of youthful underachievers in the Mexican-American community. Employees of another aerospace firm, Atlantic Research Corp. of Costa Mesa, have established an organization patterned after COY.


