Hours for the North Torrance branch, 3604 W. Artesia Blvd., are Mondays and Thursdays, 12 noon to 9 p.m.; Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; and closed Wednesdays.

Walteria branch, 3815 W. 242nd St., will be open from 12 noon to 9 p.m. on Mondays and Wednesdays; 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays; closed Tuesdays.

Hours at El Retiro branch, 126 Vista del Parque, are 12 noon to 9 p.m. Mondays and Tuesdays; 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays; closed Fridays.

Closed days at North Torrance and Walteria branches have been changed so that no more than one branch will be closed on any given day.

Hours at Post Avenue Library, 1345 Post, will remain the same: 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. during the week and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturdays. The new hours will be in effect until Sept. 13.
