Army Spec. 4 Gary J. Pangelina, 21-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Pangelina of 304 Realty St., Wilmington, has been awarded the Army heroism in Vietnam.

Wins Tract OK

Specialist Pangelina also has earned the Combat Infantryman Badge, given since World War II for sustained contact against an enemy in ground action. He also received the Purple Heart.

The Army Commendation Medal was awarded for heroism in action while engaged in ground operations against a hostile force last Feb. 27 while serving as a radio-telephone operator with Company E, 2nd Battalion, 35th Infantry, 4th Infantry Division. His platoon came under

heavy enemy fire while on a search and destroy mission. Although injured, Pangelina called for a helicopter to evacuate the wounded, then began a search for a suitable landing site. He then directed the helicopters to the landing zone until all the wounded were safely evacuated. Specialist Pangelina entered the Army in July, 1967, and completed basic training at Ft. Ord. He arrived in Vietnam last December. His wife, Josephine, lives at 1547 Abila St.

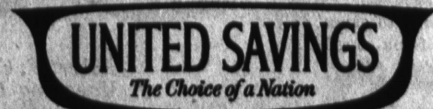
