Redondo Soldier Gets Silver Star

One of the nation's highest awards for heroism in combat has been awarded to Spec. 4 William D. Susol, 21-year-old son of Mrs. Marjorie Hutchison of 1712 Esplanade, Redondo Beach.

Susol received the Silver Star in special ceremonies at Ft. McClellan, Ala., where he is now assigned.

The Silver Star was presented for heroism in action against enemy forces in Vietnam last Nov. 23.

SUSOL, then a private first class, was serving with Troop F, 17th Cavalry on search and destroy mission near Tam Ky when the force came under intense enemy attack.

The operations officer of the 4th Battalion, 31st Infantry — also operating in the strike — was knocked from an armored personnel carrier by an anti-tank weapon. The platoon was ordered to retreat before anyone — except Susol — realized the officer had been thrown from the carrier. During the retreat, the wounded officer was run over by the carrier.

Susol jumped from the carrier, ignoring the heavy fire, and dragged the wounded officer some 50 meters through rice paddies to a safe area, where he was treated and evacuated.
