Security Measure
Fails Bomb Hoax

Four young pranksters from Torrance and Redondo Beach were taken into custody by sheriff's deputies Thursday evening when they were caught trying to smuggle explosives into the Los Angeles County men's central jail.

This, incidentally, is where accused assassin Sirhan B. Sirhan is incarcerated.

Arrested were Robert Glass, 18, of 1403 S. Satalina Ave., Redondo Beach; Thomas R. Young, 20, of 261 W. 231st St., Torrance; James N. DeAugustine, 18, of 877 Avenue B, Redondo Beach; and a 17-year-old Redondo Beach youth.

A routine check of the suspects' car turned up two artillery ground burst simulators with two ounces of photo flash powder. Sheriff's spokesmen described the device as a "big firecracker," incapable of doing serious damage.

Simulators merely create a "fire ball and a lot of smoke," spokesmen said.

Hit-Run
Suspect
Jailed

An off-duty California Highway Patrolman helped Torrance police arrest a hit-and-run suspect Thursday night.

The patrolman told police he observed a car strike two parked vehicles in the 2800 block of Ardath Avenue at about 11:30 p.m. and then continue on without stopping.

The patrolman said he followed the car to Artesia and Crenshaw boulevards, where he hailed the driver to the curb.

The suspect arrested was Douglas M. Tewell, 21, of 3917 W. 186th St. Added to the charge were counts of driving under the influence of an intoxicant, possession of stolen property, and assault with a deadly weapon.

Tewell received the last charge after a witness to the alleged hit-and-run and the suspect attempted to run him down with the car after striking the two parked vehicles.

The youth were charged with bringing explosives on jail grounds and possession of marijuana.

Sheriff's deputies said they are continuing to enforce rigid security measures at the jail.

Dog Fees
Come Due
Tomorrow

Dog license fees for the fiscal year 1968-69, amounting to \$4 per dog, become due tomorrow for pets 4 months of age or older living in Carson, Lawndale, Lomita, Rolling Hills, and Rolling Hills Estates. These cities contract with the county for animal control services.

Fees will also be required for dogs living in unincorporated county territory. Application envelopes may be obtained at the city halls of any of the above-mentioned cities or from sheriff stations, health centers, and fire stations.

Licenses are available at the Animal Shelter, 216 W. Victoria St., Gardena, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays through Saturdays, beginning July 1.

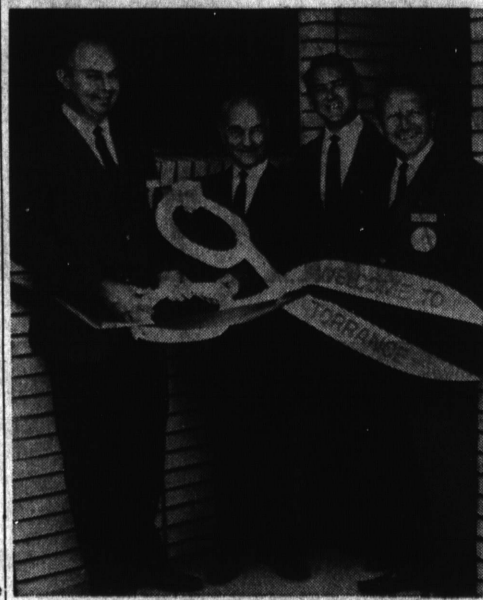

All application requests must give the owner's full name, address, telephone number, and a description of the dog. The application must also contain a valid rabies vaccination certificate.

Queen Mary Takes Off
Weight; Gets Mud Pack

The Queen Mary is taking off weight and receiving a mud pack, but neither is intended to improve her looks.

Following the ship's six-week stay in drydock at the Long Beach Naval shipyard, the mammoth task of converting it to a museum, hotel and convention center has begun in earnest.

Some 8,000 tons of steel and machinery are being removed from the lower decks of the ship to create a huge, open area. This space will house an adventurous Museum of the Sea, currently under development by the California Museum Foundation. A mammoth tearing-out job will give the Museum a 50-foot ceiling.

THE MUD pack is intended to compensate for the loss of weight, to maintain stability, and prevent listing and top-heaviness. As the salvaged steel is removed, a special high-density mud is pumped into the liner's double-bottom tanks.

Applying the mud pack to the royal lady is the IMC Mud Drilling Co. of Houston and Long Beach, which usually provides drilling mud for oil field operations. The mud used is, of course, not the common garden variety, but a fluid mixture of heavy materials — primarily bentonite and limestone.
