Mary McCoy, a store clerk, hurt her back and hip when a heavy case of goods fell on her. The store carried insur-ance and Mary got, medical care and payment for her loss of wages. When her injury lingered on for more than a year the insurance company

lingered on for more than a year, the insurance company told Mary that it would not pay for any further treat-ment. Its doctor believed that she needed no more care. Mary still complained of pains. A month later she went to several other doctors of her own choice. They all said that she had a ruptured disc which called for removal. Mary's operation was expen-sive, but she felt better. Mary asked her employer's insurance carrier to pay the new medical bill. When it re-fused, she asked the Indus-

fused, she asked the Indus-trial Accident Commission to make it pay.

WITH SOME exceptions, no worker can ask his employer to pay for medical treatment, for an accident on the job, when he gets the treatment on his own.

on his own. When the employer refuses further medical care, even if based on the mistaken opin-ions of his own doctors, the worker can go about getting care from his own doctor. If he can show that he needed the added treatment to cure the injury the worker can the injury, the worker can make the employer, his in-

The workmen's compensa-tion laws require employers to insure their workers against injuries on the job or against injuries on the job of connected with their work. Medical care, payments while off work, and payments for any permanent injuries are all available to the worker whether or not he has been careless.
