Solons Draw Average of \$22,500 During Session

In the assembly, the average was \$22,641 for each of the 79 members who were in the house all year. The average in the senate was \$22,472 for the 39 senators who were members all years.

In addition, members are provided state-leased automobiles and charge their gaso-line and oil on state credit cards. Maintenance and repairs are included in the lease price. In the senate, mem-bers must pay lease costs in excess of \$200 per month.

Two members drew totals of more than \$24,000 for the year, while 23 members had totals of more than \$23,000:

THE BULK of the money was paid in salary, which is \$16,000 a year, and living expenses while in session. The latter is \$25 per day, seven days a week, and amounted to about \$6,000-\$6,100 for most

Members are paid their \$25 daily living expenses even if they do not attend sessions, provided they are excused on "legislative business." Leaders in the two houses were concerned during the year about the high rate of absenteeism but apparently most of this was on legislative business, as most members col-lected almost the total living

expenses.

The bookkeeping system on The bookkeeping system on legislative expenses in 1967 included a new "miscellaneous" category, which was supposed to cover travel other than in the leased car, other car rentals, and incidental expenses.
