"Whether we realize it or not, we're all to some degree in prison," Eugene D. Tyc, of San Diego, California, told an audience in 1st Church of Christ, Scientist, Monday night.

Age, sickness, unemploy ment-lack of education, con ment—lack of education, com-panionship, money—alcohol-ism, drug addiction, lawless-ness—fear, hatred, pride— these were some of the "prisons" he named.

"The truth about man's real nature," Tyc concluded ". . . will open the door of every prison, not eventually, but right now."

A Christian Science practitioner, actively engaged in the healing ministry of this church, Tyc is currently on tour as a member of the Board of Lectureship of The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass.
