





Three firefighters sustained minor injuries in fighting the blaze, which broke out in an upstairs apartment at 1339 W. Carson St. Los Angeles City firefighters worked for more than an hour to control the fire, which gutted the building and did damage estimated at more than \$15,000. A small Chihuahua dog was killed in the fire, it was reported.
