If you are not familiar with them, just run down the list with me First of all, RTD sells month ly passes, allowing unlimited one-zone riding. These passes sell for \$12.00, with the Senior Citizen variety going for \$9.00. The Shopper's Pass at 35c gives you ten (10) bus rides in the downtown Los Angeles Shopping Area. Senior Citizens discounts are good during the slack part of the day and evenings. The Student Privilege Card gives the students under 21 a 50 per cent reduction. In addition, the 5 cent transfer can save you 25 cents on many combination fares. All this, and they don't even call it a white sale.

Q. How would I get from the Del Amo Shopping Cen-ter to Hacienda Heights near West Covina? Mr. R.S.

A. I would suggest you take a snack along with you and catch the 102 line at Carson and Hawthorne Boulevard, change to the 5 line and ride to 6th and Broadway, L.A. Walk 3 blocks east to the new terminal and catch the 53-V to Hacienda Boulevard and Valley. You didn't say where in Hacienda Heights, so this is the best I can do.

A. Some schedules provide better connections than others, but I would allow an hour and a half, at least.
