
Basketball Playoffs Scheduled

NBA PLAYOFF POOL GROWS

The National Basketball Association playoffs will have a playoff pool of \$320,000, \$40,000 more than last year's playoff pool and \$140,000 more than the 1966 playoff money

The top four teams in each of the NBA's two divisions will participate in the playoffs.

The first round, involving the first and third place teams and the second and fourth place teams in each division, will be a best-four-out-of-seven ser-

The two winners in each division will meet in a best-four-out-of-seven series to establish a divisional champion

These two division winners will meet in a bestfour-out-of-seven championship series,

If the divisional first place winner, with the best seasonal winning percentage, should emerge as the champion, the team would receive \$92,000 for its winning share.

The \$320,000 playoff pool will be divided as follows

• The team having the highest percentage standing at the close of the schedule season shall receive \$5,000. If the first place teams in their respective division are tied in percentage points, each is to receive \$5,000.

• Each team which finishes first in each division the close of the schedule season shall receive \$17.500.

Each team which finishes second shall receive 10,000.

· Each team which finishes third shall receive \$5,000
