

Entries are being accepted for the golf tournament for boys and girls, age 22 and under, at the Alondra Park Country Club in Lawndale during the Easter vacation.


Boys and girls 16 years of age and under, and 17 through 22, will participate in four divisions of play. There will be first, second, and third place trophies in each of the four divisions.
