If you make it a "funfest" for your newly acquired puppy at the time he first learns to sustain the feels of a leash it will help young Bowser learn that much easier and faster. A puppy of only a few weeks can become skilled in the use of a leash without any trouble, if the training is done correctly.

I would recommend the use of a slim, lightweight collar. At first, most likely, the little canine tyke will sit down and attempt to scratch it off when he suddenly becomes aware of the strange sensation around his neck. But don't let it deter you from his training program as he'll soon forget it if you direct

his attention along more pleasurable lines such as some play or calling him to you. Like the pup's collar, use a lightweight, preferably nylon, leash.

Place the collar-leash combination on the puppy's neck so that the collar segment is close up behind his ears, not low where any pull will choke him. And make certain not to hold the leash taut; keep it as slack as possible.

THEN ALLOW the puppy to lead you wherever he wants to go, running with him if necessary, and trying always to keep that aforementioned slack in the leash so he won't feel a pull or be

jerked. Praise the puppy as he proudly progresses in his leash training; pet him often especially if you trip over him as he darts from one side to the other or if he gets tangled up.

Another tip I would like to pass on to my readers is the fact that the lessons should be kept short; about 10 minutes at a time will suffice. Rewarding the puppy with a treat such as a "Liv-A-Snap" after each training session is an excellent idea.

The main goal is to make the puppy's first leash and collar training a happy and anticipated time. You can begin controlling him later and much sooner than you think, if he has fun at the start.

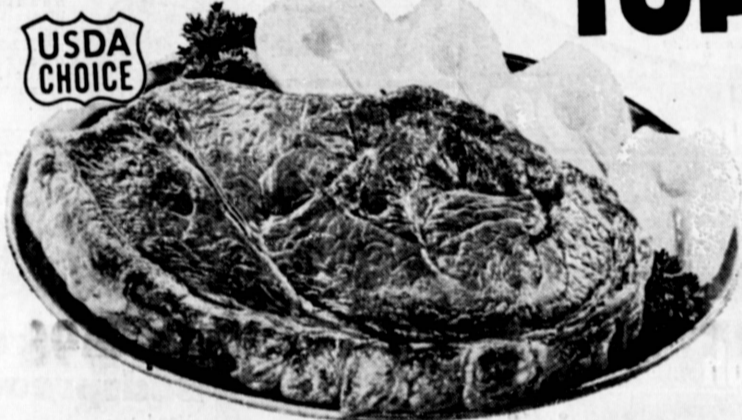

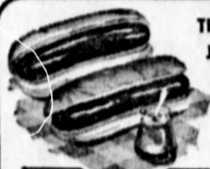
