

## Adventists Discuss Health

"The World's Most Efficient Machine—The Human Body" will be the subject of special services at Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church, 1610 Acacia Ave., Saturday, July 6, at 11 a.m.

During the church's lay activities period, members of the local congregation will be told the relationship of the human body to good "spiritual health," according to Alfred Gordon, lay activities leader.

"The maintaining of good health is as much a part of good religion as is faithfulness in church attendance or prayer," the lay leader asserted in announcing the special service.

"Despite centuries of human effort, man has not yet created a machine which excels the human body in overall efficiency, particularly in terms of the delicate shading of the human emotions. This machine is the product of a super-human Scientist, and any attempt to run it without constant relationship with its Creator brings as much difficulty as do attempts to run man-made machines without continual relationship and maintenance by their creators."

## Chadwick Will Expand Faculty, Curriculum

In September, Chadwick School will change from a boarding-day school to a day school only, according to Paul G. Lee, co-director.

This change, Lee said, will enable the school to expand the number of courses in next year's curriculum, enlarge the faculty, and offer smaller classes.

An average class at Chadwick is 10 students, with only five or six students enrolled in specialized courses, such as advanced placement biology, calculus, and fifth-year language.

Only one teacher applicant in 38 is considered qualified to teach at Chadwick, Lee added.

Faculty newcomers for the fall term will include Wistar Wood, who will chair Chadwick's science department; Richard G. Pierce, who will chair the English department;

Pierce's wife, Dorothy, who will teach English; John M. Cromelin, calculus teacher, and David G. Terpenning, geometry and math teacher.

Also joining the faculty are Mrs. Adrienne Sundaram, French teacher; Ritchie Geisel, math and athletics; Mrs. Myra Bearman, art teacher; Miss Constance Opsal, music teacher; James Bronston, fifth grade teacher; Roger Coulombe, history, basketball, and baseball instructor; and Mrs. Lynne Shelly, third grade teacher.

Chadwick is the oldest independent school on the Palos Verdes Peninsula.
