## Christian Scientists Set Communion Service

A communion service will be held this Sunday in Christian Science churches throughout the world. At First Church of Christ, Scientist, 218th Street and Manuel Avenue, the service will be at 11 a.m. It is open to the community.

The lesson-sermon is titled "Sacrament" and includes these well-known passages from Matthew: "Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, Take, eat; this is my body. And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it."

Related passages from the Christian Science textbook include this statement: "It is possible—yea, it is the duty and privilege of every child, man, and woman—to follow in some degree the example of the Master by the demonstration of Truth and Life, of health and holiness." (Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures) by Mary Baker Eddy.)

Following the lesson-sermon, the congregation will

be invited to kneel in silent communion with God. This will be followed by the repetition of the Lord's Prayer, after which the congregation will sing the Doxology.

Next stop for the jack-of-all-trades was Bremerhaven, Germany, where he planned and directed the intercontinental movement of more than a million military-sponsored passengers between Europe and the United States. Sullivan's work here was so outstanding that he received the Army Certificate of Achievement.

More honors were in store for the veteran information man at his final Army post at Ft. Eustis, Va., where he

was awarded an Army Commendation Medal from the Secretary of the Army. This he received for instituting and maintaining an "active, aggressive, and imaginative information program" at the base.

Away from his desk at the Chamber, Sullivan relaxes at home in East View, Calif., (an enclave near Rolling Hills), reading a book or enjoying the company of his wife Jane.

Sully had to give up his life-long enthusiasm for horseback riding when he broke his back. The mishap occurred while he was

perched on a ladder trimming bushes around the family home. Sully says he slipped and fell backwards against a low cement wall.

The break wasn't too serious, however, and Sullivan was back at work in two months and only had to wear his therapeutic corset one month after that.

But the delicate condition of his vertebrae put a stop to a hobby that had included just about every aspect of horsemanship over the years. In his day, Sully had enjoyed polo, cross-country, horse training, and fox hunting, to name but a few.
