Folsom Offers Variety of Fish

Folsom Lake, a few miles east of Sacramento and one of the top drawing cards in of the top drawing cards in the state's system of angling lakes, probably offers a wider variety of fish species to the state's fishermen than any other single body of water.

A check in 1966, which was verified again in 1968, showed that during the period checked by fish and game officials, anglers caught 44 rainbow trout, ranging from 15 to 16 inches; 285 kokanee of the 10. to 14 inch range: 107 10- to 14-inch range; 107 bass which were split about evenly between small and largemouth species, and a combination of 174 catfish, bluegill, perch and other small fish.

A few trash fish, such as carp and suckers, occasion-ally get themselves hooked and give the anglers a thrill boatside and see that their "lunker" is a useless trash

Kohanee is the dominent species and the 10- to 14-inch size is rated as larger than at most other state reserviors. The bass have about reached their peak with about half of them being caught each year.

Catfishing takes a special technique which few anglers have learned. Patience and knowledge of the catfish habits are necessary to gain a good catch, and those who do angle for this tasty fish find that a large "cat" find that a large "cat" caught on light tackle can give one heck of a battle.


