

Delegates Named for Conference

Representatives from the Torrance Unified School District have been selected as delegates to the 42nd annual conference of the California School Employees Association, slated for July 30 through Aug. 2 in Bakersfield.

They are Mrs. Evalyn K. Renz of Hamilton School, Louis Davis of the Operations Division and Albert Lewis of the Maintenance Division.

Announcement of the selections was made today by Mrs. David Baggett, president of Torrance CSEA Chapter 19.

An estimated 900 delegates from more than 500 association chapters will take part in the four-day meeting, Mrs. Baggett said.

They will represent CSEA's 38,000-plus membership.

Food Fair Foundation Adds New Scholarships

Scholarships to California State College at Long Beach and the University of California at Los Angeles have been added to the list of educational grants to be made this year to undergraduate students throughout the country by Food Fair Stores Foundation.

Inclusion of the two California schools in the foundation program brings the total value of the educational grants to \$73,000.

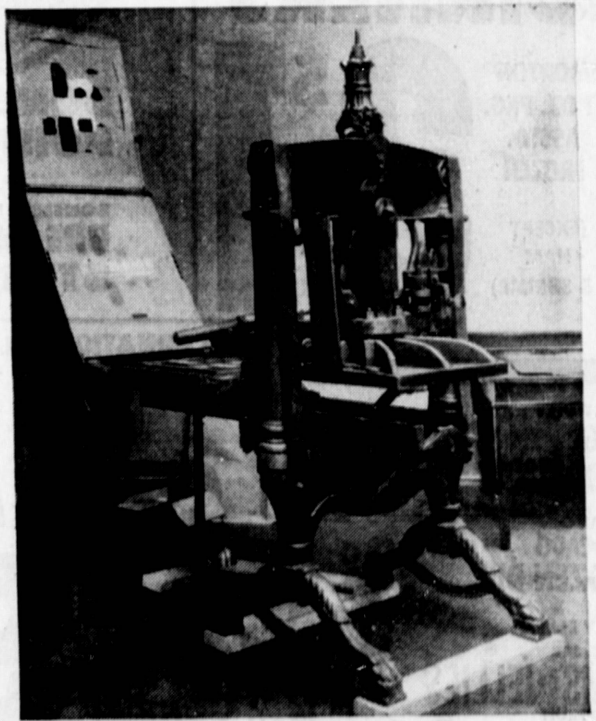
