Library **Shatters** Records

The Los Angeles County Public Library System clos-ed out its 55th fiscal year of operations on June 30 with a record-shattering circulation total of 11,184,924.

This figure is for books and magazines only and does not include 96,634 films and records borrowed nor does it include 1,904,106 reference transactions.

The huge circulation was achieved even though there was a decline of 78,215 in June, 1968, over items borrowed in June, 1967. Even so, the total number of books and magazines borrowed was a gain of 619,216 over the previous fiscal year.

County Librarian William S. Geller attributed the June decline attributed the June decline in circulation (785, 510 for June, 1968, compared to 863,725 for June, 1967) to three major factors:

1. Loss of circulation on June 4, the primary election day.

2. Public response to the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

3. The phasing out of the service contract with the City of Torrance.

In respect to the latter factor, during fiscal 1967-68 the County Library provid-ed service to the City of ed service to the City Torrance through five braries. Termination of the contract was phased out beginning in April.
