READING THE GRAIN OF THE GREEN

HEADING THE GHAIN OF THE GHAIN is the direction in which the blades of grass lie. When blades ass stand straight up, there is no grain as we think of it in golf, this will not cause the ball to break in any particular direction. But, when the blades lay to one side—you have grain. If you're ng against the grain...into the tips of the grass blades...the meets resistance and you have a slower putt. If you're going the grain, the ball runs easier and you must hit it softer...

HOLDING THE GREEN WITH

STRONG WIND AT YOUR BACK

Trying to hold a ball on a green often takes a little manipulating. Open your stance so feet and shoulders line up left of the target. To

compensate for this, open clubface and take club back on the outside. Now you can cut across the ball and put more holding spin on
