### Southwood KO'd By Hawthorne

After five victories Southwood Little League dropped a 4-3 verdict to Hawthorne American Little in the California Section 6 playoffs at Santa Ana Wednesday.

Hawthorne won the game with a one-out single in the ninth inning after Paul Sutton smashed a three-run home run with two away in the top of the sixth to tie the contest.

Jody Groshon, the star pitcher for Hawthorne, socked a base hit in the ninth to score Bob Hurley with the winning run. It followed an infield hit and a wild throw on a sacrifice bunt.

Hits by Bruce Phelps, Mike Zouras and Groshon gave Hawthorne a 3-0 lead in the third inning.

In the sixth Southwood rallied on a hit by Don Lynes, an error on Tom Bliss' grounder, and a fielder's choice by Don Moore.

Chuck Fick popped out and Hurley had a two-strike count on Sutton at the time he slammed the home run.

Southwood defeated North Redondo, 12-2; Lunada Bay, 3-1; Eastview, 2-0; Riviera, 3-1; and North Torrance, 5-0, before losing to Hawthorne.

## SPECIAL RULES APPLY

In addition to the basic rules of high school football, the following special provisions will be in effect for this year's Lions All-Star Football Game:

On conversions, the team scoring a touchdown has a choice of kicking the extra point for one point or running or passing the ball over the goal for two points.

Quarters have been extended from the regulation 12 minutes in high school play to 15 minutes.

No overtime period will be played in case of a tie at the end of 60 minutes.

The team with the lowest score in the fourth quarter has the choice of receiving the ball after all touchdowns.

## Soccer Is Growing in Torrance

Torrance may become the Williamsport of soccer! Williamsport of course, is the world headquarters for Little League Baseball, where the championship games are held each year.

The City Council of Torrance at its last meeting, approved the lease of the Ocean Avenue sump to AYSO for a five-year period. In addition to playing local games on the sump site by the AYSO and the Parks and Recreation, it is hoped that within the next several years this sump will become the world center for the AYSO Soccer Championship Games.

The AYSO was organized in Torrance in 1964 with the formation of four teams. Since that time it has grown to 74 teams in nine regions, and during 1968-69 will include Orange and San Diego counties.

The Torrance region, during 1967-68, fielded 16 teams playing in three age divisions, (Division I—13-16; Division II—10-12; Division III—7-9). From all indications, Torrance will field between 30 and 35 teams for the 1968-69 season.

The AYSO soccer games will be played on Saturdays at the Riviera School, Arnold School, Jefferson School, McGruder School and the Continental Soccer Field.

Registration will begin Sept. 7 and 14 between 10 and 12 a.m. at Walteria Park, McMaster Park, and the Jefferson School Field. A registration fee of \$5 is charged, which includes a full uniform and accident insurance coverage.
