

Aquacade Show Is 'Best Ever'

Susan Sacks, Torrance swim and water show director, describes her program which combines various forms of synchronized swimming as "a massive, well-organized aquacade, the best I've ever worked with."

This statement was made regarding the 13th annual Aquacade-Carnival, sponsored by the Recreation Department to be held at the city plunge Friday, Saturday, and Sunday at 8:30 p. m.

A UCLA student, Miss Sacks has worked as a Junior Guard for Los Angeles City Pools as well as participating in Los Angeles City Water Shows. Commenting on Torrance's Aquacade she said, "As with all the swimming I've done, I enjoy working together with eager, enthusiastic people."

CREATING and teaching a synchronized swimming club at UCLA, Miss Sacks also swam with national

champion, Billie MacKellar for three years in the Amateur Athletic Union. She also has competed in two national meets.

During Miss Sacks' junior year at college she studied at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem in Israel. At the end of the year in June 1967, she lived on a kibbutz for six days, pruning apple trees, digging trenches, and clearing away dry brush.

A SOCIAL science major, she plans to finish UCLA

where she is working for a bachelor of arts degree in elementary education and then getting her teaching credential.

Miss Sacks' current plans include additional work for a masters in special education prior to returning to Israel to live and teach.
