Unfortunate Youths Need Loving Homes

Nondelinquent Torrance children, made homeless through unfortunate circumstances, may soon need temporary homes in this area.

The "Around the Clock Services" of the Department of Public Social Services is currently looking for "Good Neighbor" homes in Torrance. The Good Neighbor program was begun in 1966 to provide emergency care for children whose parents were suddenly unable to care for them. Since then, more than 2,700 children have been welcomed into Good Neighbor homes.

Major reasons for referral of youngsters to Good Neighbor homes are abandonment, neglect, child abuse, death, arrest, or hospitalization of parent.

Average length of stay in the homes is 16 days. Good Neighbor parents are reimbursed for each child's expenses.

Wednesday night's dinner and the following morning's breakfast will be provided, but campers are requested to bring a sack lunch for the first day.

Registration will take place at the Joslyn Center, 3335 Torrance Blvd., up until the event. Cost for "Sleep-Out" is \$1.75.

Veterans' Insurance Plan Set

More than half of the 550 California veterans who hold \$4,000,000 worth of government life insurance have not yet converted these policies from term to a permanent plan, Mort Webster, manager of the Veterans Administration regional office in Los Angeles, said today.

He pointed out that in 1967, California veterans paid \$64,000 in premiums to keep both term and permanent government life insurance policies in force.

Most of the term policies are held by World War II and Korean War veterans, Webster said. Now at an average age of nearly 49, World War II veterans in California who have not converted their government life insurance will soon find their National Service Life Insurance premiums going up as a result of advancing age.

WEBSTER noted, for example, that the premium at age 40 for an NSLI term policy climbs 50 per cent at age 50, and becomes three times the age 40 premium when a veteran reaches age 60.

Although permanent insurance costs more to begin with, Webster acknowledged, the premium rates for permanent insurance never go up. Further, he said, permanent policies have loan, cash-surrender, paid-up, and extended insurance values. Term policies do not.
