Almost two-thirds of pedestrian traffic accidents involve children under 12, according to a report released today by Supervisor area and in 24 cities, including Lomita and Carson, served by the County Road Department, Chace is chairman of that department.

THE REPORT indicates THE REPORT indicates that most auto accidents occur at mid-block rather than at an intersection as might be anticipated. The ratio of mid-block to intersection collisions is 60 per cent to 40 per cent.
