'Mind' Is Topic of Sermon

Moccasin Laurels Earned

Boy Scout Troop 1060, sponsored by Ascension Lutheran Church's Board of Youth, has completed the rugged 65-mile Silver Moccasin Trail hike. The troop, led by Scoutmaster Mel Warnemuende, who is also a Sunday School teacher and elder in the church, made the week-long trip with the results of some tired feet, sore muscles, and a big appetite.

The Silver Moccasin is a special, high adventure hike offered by the Los Angeles Area Scout Council for those boys who can survive three training hikes prior to the Silver Moccasin. The trail, located high in the Angeles National Forest, is located in rugged mountain terrain.
