"I am firmly convinced that if Los Angeles is to avoid economic stagnation and traffic paralysis, this \$2.5 billion bond issue must be passed Nov. 5," Loeb-becke said. "It's as import-ant as our next breath.

"Los Angeles is at the crossroads — either the voters approve the bond isvoters approve the bond issue, or we face an even more critical problem at a later date, when construction costs go even higher. Without the system, already designed and engineered, smog and traffic congestion will become intolerable," Loebbecke said.
