PLANNING Commissioner Kenny Uyeda testified that he knew of the deal and questioned Nollac's ment, but rever questioned his integrity.



Yes, a deduction for a theft can be taken on your return. However, only the loss in excess of \$100 can be deducted.

To establish a theft loss you must be able to: (1) show the date the theft was discovered; (2) show the property was stolen and not lost or mislaid; (3) establish ownership; (4) show evidence of the cost or other basis of the property; (5) show any amount taken or show any amount taken or allowable for depreciation; and (6) show the amount of insurance or other compen-sation for the loss received or recoverable.

Computer Selects Those Returns for Tax Audits

Gifts are not taxable to the person receiving them. However, the person making the gift may be liable for gift tax if the value of the gifts to one person is more than \$3,000 in any one

The gift tax law also allows each person to make a total of \$30,000 in tax free gifts which may be spread over a period of years or used in any other year in addition to the \$3000 annual exclusion. Your mother may be entiled to use this provision of the law the situation you de-


