The greatest numerical growth in the past year was experienced by Los Angeles County with 64,100 new residents, while the highest relative growth rate was observed by Ventura County, which grew 5 per cent in the last year.

The state's least populous

the last year.

The state's least populous county, Alpine, remained constant with only 400 residents and no changes in the last three years, while Del Norte, Modoc and Trinity declined since 1960, but the combined loss was only 2,385, according to the finance department's estimates.

THE EIGHT southern counties are now estimated to contain 58.3 per cent of the total state population. up slightly from the 57.4 per cent living there in 1960. The bay area counties' share remained relatively stable at about 23 per cent. In a county-by-county count, Los Angeles County had a 1988 estimated population of 7.101,400 as compared with the 1965 estimated total of 6.868.300 persons which represented an increase of 0.9 per cent in 1968.

NINE COUNTIES of the 58 in the state, now exceed a half million in population. Second in total population was Orange County which registered 1,317,800 persons in 1968 representing an increase of 613,875 since 1960. Five counties have more than one million population, led by Los Angeles County with its 7,101,400 residents. Worthy of note, Weinberger said, is the continuing decline in both the rate and the number of natural increase and net migration for the state which amounted to 141,000 in 1968.
