A Pro Deo et Patria (For God and Country) award ceremony was held during a recent Sunday service at Ascension Lutheran Church for Life Scout Steve Lias, Star Scout Donald Tuttle, and Star Scout Ronald Tuttle, all of Boy Scout Troop 1069. The citations were presented by Mel Warne-muende, troop scoutmaster. The requirements of the Pro Deo et Patria program include five major aspects of the boy's religious life: his faith, worship, witness, world outreach, and service.

The Pro Deo et Patria emblem is granted through the Office of National Youth Agency Relationships of the Lutheran Council in the United States of America.

Catholic Criticism Of Others To Open Is Topic

Sunday, Sept. 8, will mark the beginning of the eighth year of Sunday School classes for preschoolers at St. James Catholic Church.

Public Records Act Is Now Law

SACRAMENTO — California's Public Records Act, AB 1381 by Assemblyman William T. Bagley (R-San Rafael), has been signed by Governor Ronald Reagan.

The measure does for access to public records what the Ralph M. Brown Act accomplished for open meetings. It says "access to information concerning the conduct of the people's business is a fundamental and necessary right of every citizen of the state."

Certain records under the measure are not required to be made public. These exceptions include records involved in litigation to protect the work product of the public attorney; personnel and medical files which would invade the privacy of a citizen; trade secrets which on being made public

would deprive a business of competitive advantages; data in possession of the state relating to oil and mineral findings and records specifically exempted from the records act by other statutes.

The measure also provides for discretionary release of complaints and investigatory material in the hands of correctional, licensing, and law enforcement agencies, examination data, real estate appraisals, and library and museum materials.

Like the Brown Act, there no doubt will be test cases on some of the content of the bill, but in general, the measure provides a step in the direction of carrying out the concept of the right of the people to know what its government is doing.
