

Teacher to Report To Classroom Early

Returning to Torrance school a week early will be 240 new teachers who will begin their preparations for the 1968-69 school year at a series of orientation meetings Thursday and Friday.

On Tuesday, Sept. 10, approximately 1,455 returning teachers will join the newcomers for two days of intensive preparations before classes resume.

During orientation sessions, principals will explain school procedures and policies to the new teachers and will arrange for them to tour the district's Educational Materials Building.

SPEAKER at a meeting of new elementary teachers Friday at 11 a.m. at West High School will be Dr. Lloyd G. Jones, curriculum consultant. Dr. Bruce Magner Jr., curriculum consultant, will meet with new high school teachers the same day.

Highlighting events for new teachers will be a tea to be hosted by Torrance Council, PTA, Thursday at 3 p.m., at Bullock's Tea Room.

When the rest of the teachers return, they will get classrooms ready for students, attend special meetings, and participate in additional orientation sessions.

FEATURED session will be a general meeting to be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday at El Camino College auditorium. Guest speaker will be Edward Lindaman, manager of the Interdivisional Proj-

Shery High To Expand This Fall

Beginning its second year on its own campus, Kurt T. Shery High School will have an increased enrollment, increased facilities, and a vice principal this fall.

Located at 2600 Vine Ave., the continuation high school will have 225 students during the coming year. To house the extra students, the original eight portable classrooms have been expanded to 12 portable classrooms. An addition to the portable administrative building will be completed by September.

Assisting the principal, Howard Schoen, will be vice principal Calvin Eubanks, a former West High School teacher.

CONTINUATION students will have the opportunity to enroll in either morning or afternoon classes or to attend full time. Part-time students who wish to attend morning classes will go to school from 8:30 to 11:20 a.m. Afternoon students will attend school from 12:30 to 3:10 p.m.

Course offerings will include four English courses, two courses in reading laboratory, seven business education courses, four art courses, a course in drafting, a course in health and driver education, and one psychology course.

Also under consideration are semester courses in child care, family living, and social problems.

School Jobs

All full-time and part-time workers in the schools in the fall of 1967 were estimated at 5.6 million. (This figure does not include many workers in special community programs financed from federal and foundation funds and other sources.)

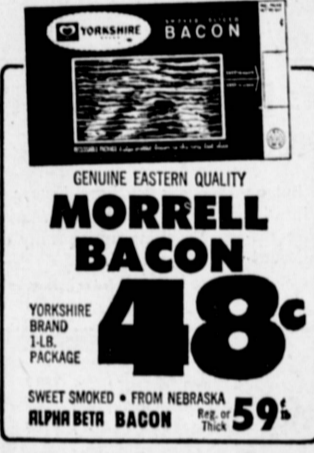
