"Don't call us-we'll call you" is a familiar, well-worn phrase in the modern-day business world of America, but it is one that is never used at the Suicide Prevention Center.

"We much prefer that they DO call us, as a mat-ter of fact," says David Klugman, a psychiatric so-cial worker who coordinates one of the most unique in-dependently operated agen-cies in the field of public welfare in the Los Angeles area area.

"However, if they don't call us and we have in some way learned of their predicament, you may be sure we will call them!" . .

LOCATED at 2521 W. Pico Blvd., Los Angeles 90006, (telephone: Dunkirk 1-5111), the Suicide Preven-tion Center is dedkated to saving lives and to further-ing basic research on the ing basic research on the phenomena of suicide. Man-ned by a staff of more than 10 psychiatrists, psycholopsychiatrists, psycholo-ts and social workers, rists their success is admirable.

Countless lives have been saved and family tragedies have been averted by these highly skilled, profesionally trained and dedicated tech-nicians in combating suicide —one of the top 10 adult killers in the United States.

THE SPC's comprehensive plan of attacking suicide in-cludes offering free clinical services on a round-the-clock services on a round-the-clock basis, exhaustive research work, the training and edu-cation of students of psy-chiatry, psychology and so-ciology to h andle the "crisis call," and the pri-mary prevention and public health goals. The team of research ex-perts, all well advanced ac-


