

Business Executives Rate The Telephone a Nuisance

Business executives are a busy breed, but many of them today find themselves occupied with inconsequential matters that eat up a lot of their valuable time.

For instance, a management consultant firm reported recently that of 591 executives surveyed 72 per cent of them consider the telephone a real detriment to getting work done.

Chief executives, the study showed, work more than 50 hours a week in the office and about 10 more at home, and yet many of them maintain they still can't find enough time for vital planning.

MANY executives have a tendency to be long-winded, particularly on the telephone. It is estimated that a typical executive spends

about five hours of his business day on the phone. And, even if he is at an important conference the magic words "a long distance call for you" will bring him to the phone on the run.

One executive feels that a lot of the time he wastes just can't be helped. He cites as an example a recent 1-hour meeting he attended. When he returned to his desk he found more than 50 different items awaiting his signature. It took him 20 minutes to accomplish this chore.

THERE'S promising news from Akron for motorists who face the annual chore of having winter tires installed, only to have them removed and stored with the return of good weather.

A new passenger tire designed to provide safe, year-round performance under virtually all weather conditions has been introduced by The B. F. Goodrich Co.

The tire, called "Radial Sun-Snow," combines the stability and long tread wear of radial-ply tires with the traction of winter tires, according to P. W. Perdriau, president of the company's tire division.

He said that the tire, available in limited quantities starting in September, will give up 60 per cent more tread wear than conventional tires under the same service conditions.

The radial-ply tire has unique tread pattern with center ribs similar to conventional passenger tires and deep outside lugs like mud and snow traction tires. The lugs are designed to take studs for better traction and control on ice and snow, he said.

Perdriau said the tire, because it has a four-ply "belt" under its tread, resists punctures and bruises to provide more blowout protection than most conventionally made tires.

THINGS TO COME — A new desk-top console file comes in two models, full desk length (58 3/8 inches) and desk top width (28 3/8 inches). The units have metal frames with wood finish tops. Newly Married Couples Eye Withholding Change

This column of questions and answers on federal tax matters is provided by the local office of the U. S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers.

I got married several months ago. If I keep on working should my husband claim my exemption or should I continue to take it?

there is no limit on the amount of tax free income you may receive from a fellowship or scholarship grant.

However, if you teach or perform other services in connection with the award, you may not exclude that portion of the award that represents payment for this work. The exception to this rule would be if all candidates for the degree, whether they have a fellowship or not, are also required to perform these services.

cent per annum, the same rate taxpayers are charged who are late in paying their taxes.

We sold some of our furniture for practically nothing when we moved. Is that a tax loss? No. The law does not allow a deduction for losses on the sale of personal property.

How far can IRS go back in checking a person's tax return? The basic statute of limitations is three years from the date the return was filed or the date it was due, whichever is later. In fraud cases or where no return is filed there is no limitation.

If you plan to file a joint return at the end of the year as most married couples do, it won't make too much difference who claims your exemption for income tax withholding purposes. However, if you think separate returns would be to your advantage then you should continue to claim your own exemption.

Whichever you decide, remember if your husband claims your withholding exemption then you will no longer be entitled to claim it. To make a change in the number of exemptions claimed, a new withholding certificate, Form W-4, Employee's Withholding Exemption Certificate, should be filed with your employer.

I have a little antique shop that I operate part-time. Can I put what I make from this business into a tax-free retirement plan?

Up to 10 per cent of your net earnings from the shop, up to a maximum of \$2,500, may be invested in a self-employed retirement plan. Your contributions to such a plan can be deducted. For details on retirement plans for self-employed individuals, send a post card to your district office and ask for Document No. 5592, Retirement Plans for Self-Employed Individuals.

Carson Given Funds To Improve Boulevard

Approval of an allocation of \$115,000 to assist the City of Carson in improving a section of Lomita Boulevard has been announced by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The section of Lomita Boulevard affected is between Main Street and Wilmington Avenue, Supervisor Chace said.

Work will consist of widening the existing two-lane roadway to a four-lane roadway, the Supervisor said, following action of the Board of Supervisors.

Supervisor Chace pointed out that the proposed improvement is part of a project programmed by the county for the widening of a 3.5-mile stretch of Lomita Boulevard between Normandie Avenue and Alameda Street.

A fully curbed and divided highway is planned, the Fourth District Supervisor said. The 1968-69 county budget includes subsidies of over \$45.6 million for highway programs within the county's 77 cities—up to 20 per cent over last year's allocation. This is \$7.65 per capita of unincorporated population, Chace said.
