

Adventists To Receive Offering

Ways to expand a \$46,000,000 missions program which operates in 190 countries around the world will be discussed at Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church, 1610 Acacia Ave., Saturday, at 11 a.m.

The missions program, explains Pastor Pillor, includes work in health, education, welfare, and uplift which has been in operation since 1874 when Seventh-day Adventists sent their first missionary abroad.

"During the more than 90 years of service given by Seventh-day Adventist missionaries abroad, multiplied millions of persons have been helped to better lives," said Pastor Pillor.

Pastor Pillor said a special offering will be taken during the 11 a.m. worship service to help expand the foreign missions program of the Seventh-day Adventist denomination.

"Millions of people await the help that Christian Missionaries can bring to body, mind, and spirit," said Pastor Pillor. "We want to be part of the answer to the world's problems, not part of the problem itself. As Christians we can do no other."

Bible Series Slated

Enrollment for the fall semester of the Bethel Bible Series will be held Thursday at Ascension Lutheran Church, 17910 S. Prairie Ave. Classes start Oct. 2.

The Bethel Bible Series enables individuals to participate in an organized program that combines visual aids with reading assignments and class discussions in a systematic reading of the Bible. The course provides a thread to cohesively tie together the history of the Children of Israel and of Christ that many Christians may have learned in a piecemeal, disjointed manner.

The Bethel Bible Series began at Ascension four years ago. At that time Rev. Lloyd C. Warneke, pastor, took a two-week course from the author of the Bethel Series, Rev. H. A. Swiggum of Madison, Wis.

Christ Church to Mark 75th Year in Redondo

Plans are under way for a special observance of the 75th anniversary of the establishment of Christ Church, 408 S. Broadway, Redondo Beach, oldest Episcopal church in the area.

Clergy from surrounding parishes—Hermosa Beach, El Segundo, Inglewood, Hawthorne, Palms Verdes Estates, and Palms Verdes—have been invited to attend the anniversary celebration set for Sept. 29 at 4 p.m. at the church.

Following the service, dinner will be served an estimated 250 guests in the parish hall.

The observation will actually be a triple anniversary—75th year of the church's founding, the 20th year since it became a parish, and the 20th year of Fr. C. Lee Mills' service as rector. He came to the church 20 years ago, Sept. 2. The same year the church was raised from mission status to that of a parish.

Christ Church is considered by many as the mother church of the Episcopal parishes in the Southwest area, responsible in some manner for the establishment of St. Cross in Hermosa Beach, Holy Family in Inglewood, St. Andrews in Torrance, St.

Francis in Palms Verdes Estates, and parishes in Hawthorne and El Segundo. Services are still held in the building on Broadway built in 1893. The first Episcopal service was held in the old Redondo Beach schoolhouse and services were later held in the lobby of the Redondo Beach Hotel on Catalina Avenue.

'Substance' To Be Topic Of Sermon

Congregations in Christian Science churches throughout the world will hear a lesson-sermon this Sunday titled "Substance."

Its Golden Text is from John: "Labour not for the meat which perisheth, but for that meat which endureth unto everlasting life, which the Son of man shall give unto you."

Among related passages to be read from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by the denomination's Founder, Mary Baker Eddy, is the following: "Christianity causes men to turn naturally from matter to Spirit, as the flower turns from darkness to light. Man then appropriates those things which 'eye hat not seen nor ear heard.' Paul and John had a clear apprehension that, as mortal man achieves no worldly honors except by sacrifice, so he must gain heavenly riches by forsaking all worldliness. Then he will have nothing in common with the worlding's affections, motives, and aims."
