California Highway Patrol Commissioner H. W. Sulli-van suggests that this is an appropriate time for the en-tire family to review certain sections of the vehicle code.

"There's something for for everyone of kindergarten age or older," he said. For the drivers in the family:

• The speed limit is 25 miles per hour when passing a school building or school grounds while children are grounds while children are going to or from school dur-ing opening or closing hours and during the noon recess period. The same limit ap-plies when **passing** any school grounds which are not separated from the high-way by a fence at any time the grounds are in use by the grounds are in use by children and the highway is posted with a "SCHOOL" warning sign. • The driver of any vehi-

cle which meets or overtakes from either direction any school bus which has stopschool bus which has stop-ped to pick up or discharge any children and which is displaying a flashing red light signal visible front and rear must stop immediately before passing the bus and may not proceed until the flashing signal ceases oper-ation. It is not necesary to stop when passing a stopped stop when passing a stopped school bus at an intersection where traffic is controlled by a traffic officer or official traffic control s i g n a l, or when the school bus is in the opposite lane on a divid-ed highway.

• Remeber pedestrians have the right of way while crossing the roadway within any marked crosswalk or within any unmarked cross-walk at an intersection.

• Follow directions school crossing guards and junior traffic patrols.

For the bicycle riders in the family:

· Every person riding a bicycle upon a roadway has all the rights and duties ap-plicable to the driver of a vehicle, under the Vehicle Code, except those provi-sions which, by their nature, exampt cannot apply.

. It is unlawful to operate It is unlawful to operate a bicycle on a roadway un-less it is equipped with a brake which will enable the operator to make one braked wheel skid on dry, level, clean pavement.

• It is illegal to ride a bicycle equipped with han-dlebars which raise the oper-ator's hands above the level of his shoulders.

• The pedals of the bicy-cle may not, in the lower-most position, be more than
