Patrol Hit by Wilson

Councilman Donald E. Wilson expressed his views about the proposed North Torrance Community Patrol at Tuesday's council meeting, warning of possible danger to patrol volunteers.

"We need to be careful that these citizens are working closely with the police department," Dr. Wilson said. He commented that all volunteers should be trained and instructed by the Torrance Police Department before attempting to patrol local streets.

"Perhaps we should deputize them," Dr. Wilson mused. "We're not trying to discourage citizen participation," he said, but added that it was wrong for citizens to assume the police department is not functioning properly.

The community area patrol is currently under discussion by the North Torrance Homeowners' Association. At a recent meeting, Association President William F. Hunter expressed concern about the number of burglaries, car strippings, child molestations, and narcotics incidents in his area.

Local police have criticized the patrol plan, stating that untrained persons might be hurt by criminals or trespass on the rights of private citizens.

(Continued from Page 1) now does. The red route parallels Anza Avenue to a point near Sepulveda Boulevard, then turns east to run parallel to Lomita Boulevard, crossing industrial land.

Aerial maps and photographs showing all 12 alternate routes have been placed on display at several locations throughout the area affected by the freeway. Maps are on display at the Harbor City Park Recreation Center, 24901 Frampton Ave.; Lomita City Hall, 25332 Narbonne Ave.; Torrance City Hall, 3031 Torrance Blvd.; El Retiro Library, 126 Vista del Parque; Redondo Beach City Hall, 415 Diamond St.; and the Redondo Beach Library-North Branch, 2000 W. Artesia Blvd.

FOLLOWING the hearing by the Division of Highways, the record of proceedings, along with engineering and economic data, will be sent to the Director of Public Works in Sacramento before a final route is adopted by the State Highway Commission. Final adoption of a route may come as early as February or March, 1969. Construction, however, is about 10 years away.
