have, over the years, ob-served a number of hap-less minor municipal offi-cials fall dupe to some zealous campaign commit-tee by signing a letter to the editor without first

checking the facts. Such letters, which flow in great volume across an editor's desk in the course of political campaigns, are designed to affect the opinion of the unsophisticated reader either for or against an incumbent or political candidate without the necessity of paying for a political advertisement. Most discerning editors such letters with read painstaking care with an eye to the laws of defama-tion and libel and the "red herrings," as they are known in the trade, usual-ly are deposited un-cere-moniously in the waste paper basket where they merely add to the solid waste problem.

Today's readers, how-ever, are far more alert and will recognize that these poison pen missiles are usually prepared by professionals for the sig-nature of some believing and unsuspecting local of-ficial . . . and they follow a traditional pattern or for-

mat. The first ingredient is a series of seemingly con-nected dates and docu-ments which are correctly annotated to give the let-ter to the Editor credulity and an aura of authenti-city. This, however, is us-ually the author's last at-tempt at accuracy. The typtempt at accuracy. The typ-ical "red herring" then proceeds to take prosaic license by weaving a pat-tern of lies, half truths and quotations out of context. The "build-up," as it is known, is always fol-lowed by a series of questions designed to intimi-date, or by innuendo, to embarrass the persons about whom the letter

about when. The easiest way to spot a "red herring" is in the "closer" wherein the bid the bid big via der for free publicity via the letter to the editor rou-tine always concludes with

magnanimous declaration of his sanctity as a disinterested party motivated solely by an overpowering desire to be of service to the good of the commu-nity.

It is a cheap trick not usually employed by hon-orable persons and not normally deserving of dig-nification by retort.

However, since the scurrilous attack printed by your newspaper and signed by Torrance City Planning Commissioner Mrs. B. Shelbourn could possibly have some effect upon my live-lihood, I feel bound and tains determined to answer. I will not, however, attempt to answer for the public official about whom she official about whom she has written. He will, I am certain, be quite capable of answering Mrs. Shel-bourn in his own way.


