### Santa Ana Leads CIF in Football

After impressive opening-weekend victories, Santa Ana and Morningside grabbed the top spots in the first balloting for the "Top Ten" teams in the CIF.

Santa Ana, a 31-13 victor over Mater Dei last Thursday night, edged out St. Paul and Anaheim.

Morningside, decisive winner over North Torrance, 38-0, outdistanced second-place Savanna, a 49-14 victor over Ramona.

Anaheim, 1967 CIF, SS, "AAAA" champion, started its season out in winning form with a 28-8 triumph over Chaffey, while St. Paul shocked highly-touted El Rancho, 21-6.

The key "AAAA" encounter this weekend finds second-rated Anaheim meeting fourth-ranked Redlands.

On the "AAA" level, Morningside and Savanna continue to test "AAAA" ball clubs as they meet cross-town rival Inglewood and Savanna tests Sunset League power Marina.

AMONG the major surprises on the first weekend of prep football activity were Loyola's 14-0 victory

over Centennial and El Modena's 26-19 conquest of once-mighty Compton.
