"Children at the Gate" by Lynne Reid Banks. This sec-ond novel by the author of "The L-Shaped Room" is set in Israel and tells the mov-ing story of a woman who desperately needs children, and two young orphans numbed by the cruel events

of history.
"Heart Troubles" by Ste phen Birmingham is the first published collection of first published collection of short stories by the author of "Our Crowd" and "The Right People." As the title suggests, they tell the story of the troubles, large and small, which beset the hu-man heart — the love and man heart — the love and hate, the compromise, and sometimes the solutions which are a part of the heartaches of human living. "Our Next President" by Russell Baker is the account of a fictional 1968 presidential election in which no candidate has won a major.

candidate has won a majority and the nation faces in-auguration day without a president to inaugurate. president to inaugurate. Names of real persons are used — Johnson, Romney, Reagan, Rockefeller, etc. and the book shows how the seeds of such a failure to elect a president lie dormant in our Constitution end electoral college sys-

"The Art of Pennsylvania Dutch Cooking" by Edna Heller. The author grew up in a small town in the Amish and Mennonite farm-lands of Pennsylva'a where she learned to cook as a she learned to cook as a child. She spent many years standardizing such recipe directions as "sugar to sweeten" and "flour to stiff-en." The result of her research is this book containing many wonderful recipes for hearty, colorful dishes with names that make the reader eager to try them— names like Shoo-Fly Pie, Snively Sticks, and Booch-Waitza Gribble
