

165 Cited For Smog **Violations**

Los Angeles County Air Pollution Control District inspectors issued more than 165 citations and notices of violation during the month of August, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has reported

Inspectors checked more than 1.335 locations and responded to 157 citizens' complaints during the month. As a result, Hahn pointed out, 17 notices of violation were issued to stationary sources tionary sources.

In addition, APCD Enforcement Division inspectors issued 129 notices to apply for permits to operate equipment a dispersion ate equipment, a district method designed to insure control of air pollution from industrial and commercial operations in the Los Angeles Basin,

HAHN REPORTED that prosecution of 233 violations by the APCD during August resulted in conviction in 188 cases. Twenty-three cases involving excessive smoke from motor vehicles were dismissed by the courts upon presentation of proof of correction of the condi-

Twenty-one cases five years or older were dismis-sed to clear the courts' cal-endars. Deducting these cases, the conviction rate for

cases, the conviction rate for August was 99.6 per cent. Fines for violation were assessed by the courts in the amount of \$4,059.50.
