

Senator Ralph Dills Endorses Townsend

State Senator Ralph Dills of Gardena has formally endorsed Assemblyman L. E. (Larry) Townsend for reelection to the 67th Assembly District seat.

Senator Dills' 32nd Senate District overlaps most of Townsend's Assembly District and the two legislators share membership on three key committees in the two houses of the Legislature. These committees are the

Public Utilities and Corporations; Transportation and Commerce; and Natural Resources, Planning and Public Works.

The senator urged his constituents to re-elect Townsend "because of his keen grasp of the problems of the cities and the part he has played in passing laws to give our children a better education, protection to the senior citizens, and for his attempts to improve the lot of working men and women."

Townsend, in acknowledging the endorsement, thanked Dills for supporting the various bills establishing the Southern California Regional Occupational Center in Torrance. Townsend also played a key role in establishing the center here.

Senator Dills was a municipal court judge in Compton until he was elected to the State Senate in 1956.
