Marijuana Laws Topic For Panel

Conflicting views on marijuana—from the legal, medical and moral standpoints—will be presented in a community forum Friday at 8 p.m. at American Savings and Loan Building, 1959 Kingsdale Ave., Redondo Beach.

Taking part in the panel discussion will be Dr. James Nelson, assistant professor of neurology at UCLA School of Medicine and head of the Division of Neurology at Harbor General Hospital; Bruce Margolin, an attorney and chairman of CAMP (Committee Against Marijuana Prohibition); Allan Nelson, and attorney and chairman of a committee to study the legal status of marijuana for the American Civil Liberties Union; and a spokesman for the Peninsula Council for Youth, an organization of concerned parents to combat use of drugs and dangerous narcotics by young persons in the Palos Verdes area.

Woman Held in Shooting

Attempted murder charges have been lodged against a woman who allegedly shot her estranged husband Saturday.

Torrance police said Mrs. Paye Laura White, 47, of 15603 Firmona Ave., surrendered a .15-calibre automatic pistol when they arrived at the scene about 12:15 p.m.

Listed in satisfactory condition at Harbor General Hospital is Charles Henry White, 50, of 730 N. Inglewood Ave., Inglewood. Police found White collapsed against an apartment door at 1801 1/2 Cabrillo Ave., bleeding from bullet wounds in his chest and thigh.

The suspect, Mrs. White, said she had been staying with a friend, Mrs. Lule Edna Lowrey, at the Cabrillo Avenue address. She explained that she became alarmed when her estranged husband came to the apartment to see her. Mrs. White reportedly confessed firing the gun twice as the victim walked down the hall toward her, police said.

Mrs. Lowrey, who was in the kitchen at the time of the shooting, told police she had been talking to White in the kitchen for about 10 minutes before he walked out into the hall. The witness summoned police when she heard the shots.


