"Why do big-name stars do commercials - like Ralph Bellamy in the Geritol ad?" Either he has bills to pay just like everybody or he got enough free Geritol to last him into the next century. "Is Raymond Burr in a wheelchair on the 'Ironside' series because he has a health problem? I can't imagine any other reason for having an invalid for the hero of a police show."

The producer thinks it gives an interesting quality to the series. Presumably Burr agrees because "Ironside" is HIS show and it's done the way he wants it. On the set he never sits in it unless he's on camera. In one of the early scripts this season Ironsides was operated on unsuccessfully so he'll be sitting down for another year at least. Burr is healthy but at 260 pounds he still has a weight problem. Maybe he just likes to take it easy.

"The very best show of the summer was Dean Martin's Goldiggers. The girls were amateurs but they were so pretty they could have done without Joey Heatherton who looks cheap and Frank Sinatra Jr. who looks dumb. What will become of the Goldiggers?"

The series may be revived as a mid-season series starting in January. Meanwhile they're doing very nicely. The 12 girls - all single between 18 and 21 - will be featured on the Ernie Ford Special next month and will return to Dean Martin's show October 31, and November 28. Bob Hope is trying to get the Pentagon to give him a larger jet for his Christmas show in Vietnam to accommodate them. They may have been amateurs last summer but they're pros now.

"Who is the red-headed girl in 'Peyton Place' who plays the school chum of Tippy Walker?" Her name is Trish O'Herlihy, the Irish born daughter of actor Dan O'Herlihy. "Is the haunted house used in 'The Ghost and Mrs. Muir' a real house? Where is it supposed to be located?" The exterior of the house used in the opening episode

of the series is real. It was built by a family of shipwrights on a large estate in Montecito on the California coast near Santa Barbara about 100 years ago. An exact replica has been built at 20th Century Fox Studios. All interiors were filmed on studio sound stages. It doesn't have an exact geographical location in the script.

"My family and I enjoyed the all-Negro show titled 'Soul' on NBC this month. We are an average white family who has no opportunity for real contact with Negroes and we thought it was the best possible form of race relations to share their laughter. They obviously enjoyed themselves. Will this be a regular show?"

Its producers George Schlatter and Ed Friendly hope it will. Just a year ago these same men previewed a similar show that later became a weekly series called "Rowan and Martin's Laugh-In."

Trio Hurt; Two Cars Demolished

Three persons were injured last night in a three-car collision which demolished two vehicles.

Treated at Little Company of Mary Hospital were Mark M. Okimoto, 37, of Los Angeles; Robert Ray Coulter, 64, of 2204 Robinson St., Redondo Beach; and 2-year-old Hugh Coulter. All three were released following treatment. Witnesses told police Coulter was waiting to make a left turn from Hawthorne Boulevard west onto 190th Street when the vehicle was struck from the rear by the Okimoto vehicle. Coulter's vehicle then traveled northwest through the intersection and struck a car driven by Paul B. Simpson, 20, a Marine of 22527 Gaycrest Ave. Simpson was not injured. Both the Okimoto car and the Coulter vehicle were demolished. Simpson's car sustained moderate damage to the front end. The crash occurred about 8:30 p.m.
