Cigarette, Road Taxes Allocated

SACRAMENTO - State Controller Houston I. Flournoy has announced the distribution of more than \$61.5 million to the cities and counties of the state. Included was \$55,341,854 in highway users taxes, plus \$6,-226,377 in apportionments from the cigarette tax.

In the distribution of the highway users tax, a total of \$14,064,914 went directly to the counties; \$10,478,248 to the cities; and \$30,798,692 for expenditures on state highways.

Los Angeles County's share of the highway user's tax was \$4,273,926. Torrance received \$99,891.

THESE funds were derived from: Gasoline taxes, \$50,679,095; diesel fuel tax, \$3,197,916; transfer from the motor vehicle transport ation tax fund, \$1,463,947, and the balance from miscellaneous sources.

The apportionment of cigarette taxes gave Los Angeles County \$149,827 while Torrance received \$51,260.

The cigarette tax appor-tionment represents 30 per cent of the revenues de-posited in the cigarette tax fund during the month of September, 1968.


