## Creativity Stressed At Lomita Day School

"Creativity" is the byword at Shee'lana Pre-School now located in brand new headquarters at 2450 W. 254th St., Lomita, near the Rolling Hills Shopping Center.

Run by directors-owners Allen and Louise Schupack, Shee'lana Pre-School takes its name from the Schupacks' two daughters, Sheela and Elana.

Occupying a rustic half-acre site, the pre-school is designed especially for the needs of the small child. Landscape architect Roy Kato and landscape gardener Bob Perkins, both of Torrance, worked together to create a miniature New England forest with a log cabin, an old fashioned water pump, a sail boat, hanging rope ladders, and other attractions.

The main building includes staff offices, classrooms, kitchen, and a service porch. Classrooms are gaily decorated with a green and yellow motif.

Adjoining patios are brick-sand, with colorful round tables and stools decorated as daisies.

The most important fea-

ture at Shee'lana is the opportunity for pre-school children to enrich their understanding of self, others and the world," said Mrs. Schupack, who also serves as school nurse.

Children two through six are currently being accepted as pupils.

## New Signal Slated for Intersection

## Work Will Continue On Freeway Phones

Hundreds of emergency telephones are now being placed on Los Angeles County freeways to serve as "electronic good samaritans" to stranded motorists.

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, who fought for the life-saving devices in a 10-year campaign, cited the second six months of 1968 as "the greatest period of activity" in the installation of the full system.

Two years ago he was successful in obtaining Board of Supervisors' approval to install more than 2,300 phones at quarter-mile intervals throughout the County freeway system. Completion is set for early 1970.

ALREADY complete are the Harbor, Pasadena, San Diego, Pomona, and Long Beach freeways.

The phones are being installed by both Pacific and General Telephone companies. They provide a direct line to Los Angeles Police or California Highway Patrol Headquarters.

Hahn says the telephones are "electronic good samaritans" which have proven their value in bringing quick assistance to persons involved in accidents and to motorists whose cars have broken down.
