SACRAMENTO — The Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control has announced the distribution of \$4,564,676 of alcoholic beverage license fees and payments to the cities and counties of the state.

Ten per cent of all license and renewal fees and payments and all transfers of existing licenses is withheld by the state as revenue for the general fund.

The remaining 90 per cent is distributed semi-annually to the counties and cities of the state in proportion to that amount of fees collected in the counties.

The distribution shows that the unincorporated area of Los Angeles County will receive \$166,202 while the city of Torrance will get \$26,146.
