

is required.

loaf (1-lb.) Bridgford frozen ready to bake bread

cup white raisins tablespoon brandy

cup sugar

tablespoon flour package (8-oz.) cream cheese, softened

teaspoon butter, melted tablespoon sour cream teaspoon grated lemon

1/2 teaspoon vanilla 3/4 teaspoon sugar 3/4 teaspoon cinnamon Let frozen loaf soften at room temperature about

two hours. Or, in plastic bag (to keep surface moist) in refrigerator 8 to 10 hours. Cut into 12 pieces; roll each into a cylinder about 15" long (Use hands to roll dough on floured board). dough on house boards.

With each cylinder to form a loose pinwheel 2" apart on greased cookie sheet. (Make pinwheels loose; dough comes together as it rises). Pour brandy over raisins. Mix together sugar and flour; add to cream cheese and blend all together along with butter, sour cream, lemon rind, vanilla and lemon rind, vanilla and brandy - raisin mixture. Place about 2 tablespoons of cheese mixture in the center of each pinwheel. Mix sugar and cinnamon; sprinkle over rolls. Let rise in a warm place until in a in a warm place until in-creased in volume 2 or 4 times. Bake 375 degrees about 15 minutes or until

Gas Company to Bring **New Supplies to State**

Lighting system, the local gas distributors, expressed gratification this week about Federal Power Commission authorization of additional volumes of natural gas for the Southern California

The FPC approved delivery of an additional \$154 million cubic feet of gas per day by El Paso Natural Gas Co. to Southern California Gas Co. and Southern Coun-ties Gas Co. of California.

The local companies—sub-sidiaries of Los Angeles-based Pacific Lighting Corp. —will distribute the gas to their more than 3 million customers throughout South. California, including electric generating agencies.

PACIFIC Lighting officials estimate that the first vol-umes of the additional gas will be received in the Southern California area in

Companies of the Pacific approximately five months with all of the new volume to be available in sever

The additional 154 million cubic feet per day is a 5.9 per cent increase over the per cent increase over the presently approved gas supply of the local utilities, including California source gas. It represents a 7.6 per cent increase in certificated volumes which the local distributors receive from cut tributors receive from outof-state

The Pacific Lighting companies expect to complete construction of a 45 - mile pipeline system between Whitewater and Cactus City northeast of Palm Springs in mid-November. This pipe line section will help bring the additional gas to mar-
