Negotiations Under Way To Acquire New Company

Paint Firm Hits High In Profits

For the 21st consecutive year, Standard Brands Paint Co. in fiscal 1968 achieved new record operating re-sults as both sales and earn-ings increased 16 per cent over the previous fiscal year, Sid Greenberg, presi-dent, announced today. For the year ended Sept.

30, net sales amounted to \$34,345,897 compared with \$29,541,599 in fiscal 1967. Earnings after taxes were \$2,342,341 or \$1.86 a share based on 1,259,500 average shares outstanding, despite the federal income tax sur-charge which amounted to 13 cents per share. For the

1967 fiscal year earnings, were \$2,018,716 or \$1.61 a share based on 1,250,217 average shares outstanding. Greenberg said, "Several important factors contribu-

ted to the year'e ssuccess in-cluding the expansion of manufacturing and ware-housing facilities in fiscal nousing facilities in fiscal 1967, an increased demand for the company's products. more efficient methods of marketing, and the contin-ued acceleration of our store remodeling program." DURING FISCAL 1968, the company opened near the company opened new stores in El Cerrito, located in the San Francisco Bay area, and in Monterey Park, a suburb of Los Angeles. The company now operates 30 paint and decorating cen-ters in California and Arizona

zona. Greenberg said, "Current-ly, work is well under way on the company's 31st store which is located in La Habra. The company has additional sites in several California communities and is negotiating for other lo-cations."

cations." He concluded, "The fu-ture looks as bright as the past for Standard Brands Co. We feel confident that fiscal 1969 will be a year of continued progress and de-velopment in all areas of op-erations."
