Dad to Have 'School Day'

"Fathers Day at School" with fathers attending a typical day at school with his youngster, will be featured at the Torrance Cooperative Nursery School, Inc. 4558 W. 182nd St., on Nov. 23. Classes begin at 9 a.m. and continue until 12 noon.

The cooperative preschool, under the sponsorship of the Adult Education Department of the Torrance Unified School district, is staging this 16th annual "Fathers Day" to acquaint the fathers with their child's daily program and to give the child an opportunity to share his first school experiences with his dad.

Torrance Cooperative Nursery School is the only nursery school in southern

California operating under the sponsorship of a school district, according to Mrs. Joe Rizzo, membership chairman.

The director-teacher's salary is paid by the district with the aid of state funds. Beyond this, the school is self-supporting, is licensed by the State Welfare Department, and is a non-profit corporation.

Children, ages 3 to 5 years, attend four mornings a week. Each mother assists one morning a week at the school and both parents attend a mandatory parent-education class three times a month.
