\$75 Million Recorded Here in Retail Sales

Capitol News Service — Taxable sales in California set a record for July, August, and September of nearly \$10 billion, representing an average 10 per cent spending increase for each state resident, the State Board of Equalization reported today.

It was only the fourth time in more than 30 years that summer taxable sales surpassed the previous Yule season's total.

The taxable sales in Torrance reached \$75,810,000 despite the 10 per cent income surtax.

NEW CAR sales, largest producer of sales tax revenues, jumped 20 per cent for the July-September period, and used cars were up 9 per cent.

Third quarter sales in Los Angeles County amounted to \$3,688,054,000.

Building materials, in the dollars during 1966 and 1967, shot up by 16 per cent during the third quarter and 22 per cent in the second quarter as compared to figures for a year ago.

THE \$9.97 billion in July-September sales resulted in \$398 million in state sales and use tax revenues at the state's 4 per cent rate. The board also collected nearly \$100 million for cities and counties with their 1 per cent rate.

Comparable figures for the April-May-June period were \$9.6 billion in total taxable sales, providing the state with \$385 million in taxes and the cities and counties with \$96 million in taxes.

These sales exclude more than \$2 billion spent quarterly for food, gasoline, some drugs and other sales of tax-exempt products.

South High Names Top Homemaker

Randi L. Hopkins has been named 1969 Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow at South High School where she is a senior. The award is based on her score in a test on homemaking given Dec. 3.

Miss Hopkins is now eligible for state and national scholarships. She also has been awarded a specially designed silver charm from General Mills, sponsor of the Betty Crocker Search for the American Homemaker of Tomorrow.

Townsend Bills to Aid Regional Skills Center

Assemblyman L. E. (Larry) Townsend (D-67th District) has introduced four bills in the current session relating to regional occupational centers. The bills will, in effect, overcome several problems and provide for the orderly operation of the Southern California Regional Occupational Center here, as well as other occupational centers in California, Townsend said.

Five bills previously introduced by Townsend were enacted into law in 1967 and 1968.

According to Haig Marashlian, director of planning and development of SCROC and legislative advocate for the district, the development of the SCROC program would not have been possible without the legislative program.

The four bills just introduced by Townsend are:

- AB 140 which relates to budget procedures and the establishment of a uniform tax rate over participating districts in centers where two or more districts cooperate through a Joint Powers Agreement to provide for vocational-technical training program.
- AB 141 provides for state apportionments from the State School Fund to accrue directly to the Center in the case where such Center is established by a Joint Powers Agreement.
- AB 142 provides for a uniform foundation program for all students in attendance at a center operated under a Joint Powers Agreement equivalent to the amount provided in Article 2.1 commencing with Section 17671 of Chapter 3 of Division 14 of the Education Code.
- AB 207 extends the time limit on credentialing of vocational education teachers employed by regional occupational centers till such time as instructors are available in sufficient quantity to meet the needs.
