**Adventists Tell Dangers of 'Pot'**

With marijuana being considered by many as a drug that should be legalized, David H. Pillor, pastor of the Torrance Seventh-day Adventist church, warned this week that "pot changes the personality, weakens the will power, and totally disrupts the life."

**'The Mind' Is Topic Sunday**

"The Lord God hath given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him that is weary; he wakeneth morning by morning, he wakeneth mine ear to hear as the learned." This verse is part of the Bible Lesson-Sermon titled "Mind," and will be read in all Christian Science churches this Sunday. Services at Torrance First Church of Christ, Scientist, will begin at 11 a.m.

Temperance secretary, Mrs. Bernice Moshos, pointed out that mostly the "young, emotionally immature, and unproductive resort to such artificial means of satisfaction, or escape." She added, "It is strange that young people at the age when they want most to be recognized as mature adults, able to think for themselves, toss overboard the greatest mark of maturity — clear heads — and surrender their minds to a weed because someone has sold it as the 'in thing'."

One of the selections to be included from the denominational textbook is the following: "Mind is not necessarily dependent upon educational processes. It possesses of itself all beauty and poetry, and the power of expressing them. Spirit, God, is heard when the senses are silent" ("Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy).

Saturday, during church service, emphasis will be given the value of sharing information on such dangers via the wider circulation of the denomination's temperance magazine, "Listen." Adventists contribute annually to the journal, which is distributed widely in high schools for education on subjects as narcotics addiction, alcoholism, and tobacco addiction.



**Assembly Chooses Minister**

The Reverend Robert Bloom of Burbank, was elected pastor of the Hermosa Beach Assembly of God Tabernacle at a membership business meeting.

Rev. Bloom, who will lead the local congregation in the completion of the church edifice now being built near the corner of Third and Pacific Coast Highway, has been a pastor and evangelist for his denomination the past 25 years. Fourteen of those years he was a director for the youth organization of the Assemblies of God — known as Christ's Ambassadors.

The minister received his secular and theological education in Southern California schools. He also traveled in Europe and the Holy Land. While the new building is under construction the local congregation meets in the Clark Stadium community building.

**Bishop To Bless Sanctuary**

Bishop Gerald Kennedy will consecrate the new sanctuary of the Riviera United Methodist Church Sunday at the regular 10:10 a.m. service. The new structure, located at 375 Palos Verdes Blvd., was completed late last fall.

Bishop Kennedy, of the Los Angeles Area of the United Methodist Church, will preach the sermon and pronounce the act of consecration. Assisting in the service will be the Rev. Melvin Talbert, superintendent of the Long Beach District; the Rev. Hans Holborn, minister of the church; and the Rev. John Nagel, the church's associate minister.

Little more than 10 years ago Bishop Kennedy consecrated the first buildings of the Riviera congregation which consist of a chapel, used for regular services during those 10 years, and educational rooms, social hall, and offices.

The new sanctuary seats approximately 500 and is designed with a large chancel area for dramatic and musical presentations as well as for worship. A lower level in the new building is still to be completed, providing for a kitchen, choir rehearsal room, stage and dressing room area, and large fellowship hall.
