
go to the associations' scholarship fund. Reservations are being taken by Mary Savidan, ways and means chairman.

The shower will make available garments for the infants and help instigate the new service, Stork Express.

Volunteer workers will be authorized to pick up new born babies at local hospitals, dress the baby, sign release papers, and deliver the baby to a foster home, where it will be cared for until adoption. Each baby is dressed in new clothes and provided with a layette.


Eight auxiliaries in the Long Beach Council will aid in this service, relieving social workers of this task allowing them more time for case work, thus speeding up the placement of babies. During 1968, 1,903 children were placed in foster homes, an impressive number considering the limited group of social workers. \* \* \*
